The Independent Authority for Spanish Fiscal Responsibility, AAI (AIReF) was founded with the mission of overseeing strict compliance with the principles of budgetary stability and financial sustainability set out in Article 135 of the Spanish Constitution.

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# 1. INTRODUCTION

In the first quarter of each year, the Independent Authority for Fiscal Responsibility, AAI (AIReF) must prepare and publish an annual Action Plan in accordance with Article 5 of its Organic Statute. In addition to mandatory reports, the Plan includes opinions, any requested studies and other actions intended to improve its work. The Action Plan therefore represents the Institution's public commitment to society with respect to its activities during the year.

The 2022 Action Plan details the second year of activity carried out under the [2020-2026 Strategic Plan](#), published on September 25<sup>th</sup> 2020. The fundamental objective of this six-year Plan is to consolidate this young institution as a useful tool for society. To this end, AIReF's actions will focus on four strategic aims: in-depth fiscal supervision of the General Government; ensuring the sustainability of public finances with a long-term vision; making public policy evaluation a core activity of AIReF, and strengthening the principles of independence, transparency and accountability.

The 2022 Action Plan is framed within a transition period characterised by the expectations that the most acute stage of the COVID-19 crisis will have passed, the implementation of the Recovery, Transformation and Resilience Plan (RTRP) and because it is expected to be the last year of the suspension of fiscal rules as a consequence of maintenance of the escape clause provided for in the Law on Budgetary Stability and Financial Sustainability before the return to a likely new framework of fiscal rules in 2023.

Activation of the escape clause, in effect since 2020, does not imply the absence of fiscal supervision, but it does directly affect AIReF's activity. In particular, with the suspension of the fiscal rules and the replacement of fiscal targets with reference rates, the possibility of activating the preventive, corrective and coercive mechanisms of the Organic Law on Budgetary Stability and Financial Stability and, consequently, the corresponding AIReF reports on this matter, is cancelled. Of course, deactivation of the escape clause or any alterations that may occur in the fiscal framework over the course of the year would be taken into account and would be duly reflected in AIReF's actions.

The 2022 Action Plan was approved by the President on February 16<sup>th</sup> 2022, following deliberation and endorsement by AIReF's Steering Committee.

## 2. AIREF's ACTIONS IN 2022

**AIREF will evaluate compliance with this Plan, as implementation of the Strategic Plan, and its results will be summarised in the 2022 Report** to be published in the first quarter of 2023.

**This 2022 Action Plan will be monitored on an ongoing basis.** Every six months, the Steering Committee will assess its level of execution and revise those aspects that require updating.

### 2.1. Reports, opinions and studies planned for 2022

**1. Reports planned for 2022 on the budget cycle that will be prepared in the event that the corresponding budgetary milestones triggering their issuance materialise and that the preparation of said reports is viable and makes economic sense:**

- Report on the initial budget of the General Government 2022.
- Report on the 2022-2025 Stability Programme Update.
- Report on expected compliance with budgetary stability and government debt targets and the expenditure rule.
- Report on the setting of individual targets for the Autonomous Regions.
- Report on the Macroeconomic Forecasts in the 2023 Draft General State Budget.
- Report on the macroeconomic forecasts of the 2023 Budgets of the Autonomous Regions
- Report on the draft budget and main budgetary lines of the General Government for 2023.

**2. AIREF is also responsible for drafting reports on the application of the preventive, corrective and coercive mechanisms of the Organic Law on Budgetary Stability and Financial Sustainability.** These will be drawn up in the event that the escape clause is deactivated or decisions in this regard are taken and conditions are in place for such reports to be prepared.

**3. Performance of the studies corresponding to the third phase of the Spending Review 2018-2021, which the Central Government has commissioned from AIReF.**

The third phase will focus on two themes: the strategic evaluation of the financial instruments to support productive sectors, with a special focus on the effectiveness of those aimed at promoting the internationalisation of Spanish companies; and the evaluation of urban waste management.

**4. Preparation of the action plan of the first phase of the Spending Review 2022-2026 on financial instruments to support the productive sectors and healthcare of the social security system for civil servants.**

On December 28<sup>th</sup> 2021, the Council of Ministers approved the new cycle for the Spending Review 2022-2026 in compliance with the commitment reached in Component 29 of the RTRP and established six areas to be studied, the first two corresponding to Phase 1 of the review:

- I. Expenditure resulting from healthcare of the social security system for civil servants
- II. Financial instruments to support productive sectors (complementary to the Spending Review 2018-2021)
- III. Benefits (Minimum Living Income and temporary incapacity benefits)
- IV. Official Development Assistance
- V. Employment policies
- VI. Multiannual Financial Framework 2014-2020

**5. Studies commissioned by the Government at the request of a ministerial department:**

- Preparation and publication of the study on international financial cooperation - FONPRODE, commissioned by the Council of Ministers at the proposal of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, European Union and Cooperation.

**6. Studies commissioned by Territorial Public Administrations:**

- Completion of the study commissioned by the Regional Government of Castile and Leon on institutional communication.
- Completion of the study requested by the City Council of Sant Feliu de Llobregat to assess the consequences of the early termination of an administrative concession.

- Completion of the studies commissioned by the Regional Government of Aragon: study on out-of-hospital, hospital and community healthcare pharmacy expenditure; study on the staff policy of the Department of Education, Culture and Sport and study on the funding model of the University of Zaragoza. Support in implementation.
- Preparation of the evaluation work of the commission from the Governing Council of the Regional Government of Valencia.
- Performance of the work commissioned by the Regional Government of Extremadura in the field of healthcare expenditure and active employment policies.
- Preparation and performance of the work commissioned by the Regional Government of Navarre.
- Preparation and performance of the work commissioned by the Regional Government of the Balearic Islands.

**7. Opinion on the long-term sustainability of the General Government.** In order to fulfil its strategic objective of ensuring the sustainability of public finances with a long-term vision, AIReF will prepare long-term macroeconomic and fiscal forecasts that will complement the work already carried out in the area of pensions and public debt analysis with a view to identifying the main long-term fiscal policy challenges.

**8. Opinion on the Minimum Living Income (MLI).** Article 31.3 of Law 19/2021, of May 20<sup>th</sup>, establishing the MLI, determines that the result of the MLI and the various inclusion strategies and policies will be evaluated annually by AIReF, through the issuance of the corresponding opinion. In accordance with the multi-year work plan, announced on December 16<sup>th</sup> 2021, AIReF will publish its first opinion in the first quarter of 2022.

**9. Opinion on the cessation of activity of self-employed workers.** The contribution rate for the benefit for cessation of activity for self-employed workers has been substantially modified over recent years and has become mandatory. Accordingly, AIReF will analyse the implications on the financial sustainability of the protection system for cessation of activity in accordance with the provisions of current legislation.

**Depending on the development of the rest of the work and the needs identified during the year, the Steering Committee may consider issuing additional opinions** on any relevant issue during the year. In this regard, Organic Law 6/2013, of November 14<sup>th</sup>, on the establishment of AIReF, empowers the institution to issue opinions at its own initiative on matters related to budgetary stability and financial sustainability of the General Government.
