### 1. INTRODUCTION

The Independent Authority for Fiscal Responsibility (AIReF) must draw up and annually publish an Action Plan in the first quarter of each year, pursuant to Article 5 of its Organic Statute containing, in addition to mandatory reports, opinions and studies that have been requested and other actions aimed at improving its activity. In this way, the institution takes on a public commitment to society on the activity it will carry out over the year.

The Action Plan 2023 is the third such plan drawn up under the Strategic Plan 2020-2026, published on September 25th, 2020, meaning we are now halfway through the period covered by the Strategic Plan. The fundamental objective of this six-year plan is to consolidate this young institution as a useful tool for society. To this end, AIReF's actions will focus on four strategic aims: in-depth fiscal supervision of the General Government; overseeing the sustainability of public finances with a long-term vision; making public policy evaluation a core activity of AIReF, and strengthening the principles of independence, transparency and accountability.

The Action Plan 2023 is again framed against a backdrop of high uncertainty in which, having overcome the crisis generated by COVID-19, a new source of instability has emerged following the Russian invasion of Ukraine. The impact on energy prices has pushed inflation up to levels not seen in many years, which led to an economic policy response to address its effects. Accordingly, on budgetary matters, it was decided to maintain the escape clause active at both a national and a European level, and hence the fiscal rules shall remain suspended in 2023.

Activation of the escape clause does not imply the absence of fiscal supervision, but it does directly affect AIReF's activity. In particular, with the suspension of the fiscal rules and the replacement of fiscal targets with reference rates, the possibility of activating the preventive, corrective and coercive mechanisms of the Organic Law on Budgetary Stability and Financial Stability and, consequently, the corresponding AIReF reports on this matter, is cancelled. Of course, deactivation of the escape clause or any alterations that may occur in the fiscal framework over the course of the year will be taken into account and will be duly reflected in AIReF's actions.

Two additional factors stand out in 2023 that should be taken into account in AIReF's activity. On the one hand, the unexpected acceleration of the rollout of the Recovery, Transformation and Resilience Plan (RTRP), after a slower start than originally expected. On the other hand, the debate and first steps to structure a new fiscal framework once the period of suspension of the fiscal rules ends. A specific proposal from the European



Commission has already been made which, should it materialise, would lead to significant changes in the way of understanding national and European fiscal supervision and which, among others, would involve the reinforcement and redirection of the role of Independent Fiscal Institutions (IFIs).

The Action Plan 2023 was approved by the President on February 14th, 2023, following the positive deliberation of the AIReF Steering Committee.

### 2. ACTIONS BY AIReF IN 2023

AlReF will evaluate compliance with the plan, as part of the implementation of the Strategic Plan, and the results thereof will be summarised in the Annual Report 2023, which will be published in the first quarter of 2024.

**This Action Plan 2023 will be monitored on a continuous basis**. Each half-year, the Steering Committee will assess its degree of implementation and revise those aspects that require updating.

#### 2.1. Reports, opinions and studies planned for 2023

#### 1. Reports planned for 2023

- I. The reports planned for 2023 on the budgetary cycle that will be drawn up, in the event of the materialisation of the corresponding budgetary milestones that justify their preparation and in the event that the preparation of said reports is viable and makes economic sense:
  - Report on the initial budgets of the General Government 2023
  - Report on the macroeconomic forecasts of the Stability Programme Update 2023-2026
  - Report on the Stability Programme Update 2023-2026
  - Report on the expected compliance with the budgetary stability targets, public debt and expenditure rule 2023
  - Report on the establishment of the individual targets for the Autonomous Regions
  - Report on the macroeconomic forecasts of the Draft General State Budget for 2024
  - Report on the macroeconomic forecasts of the budgets of the Autonomous Regions for 2024
  - Report on the projects and main lines of the budgets of the Autonomous Regions for 2024
- II. AIReF is also responsible for drawing up reports related to the application of preventive, corrective and coercive mechanisms of the Organic Law on Budgetary Stability and Financial Sustainability (LOEPSF). These will be prepared in the event that the escape clause is deactivated or that decisions are taken in this regard that lead to the right conditions for this to materialise.



#### 2. Opinions planned for 2023:

- I. Opinion on the long-term sustainability of the General Government. In order to cater for the strategic objective of overseeing the sustainability of the public finances with a long-term perspective, AIReF will finalise and publish the long-term macroeconomic and fiscal forecasts to complete the work already undertaken in the field of pensions and analyse public debt with a view to identifying the main long-term fiscal policy challenges.
- II. Opinion on the Minimum Living Income (IMV). Article 31.3 of Act 19/2021, of December 20th, establishing the IMV, determines that the result of the IMV and of the different inclusion strategies and policies shall be evaluated by AIReF each year through the issue of the corresponding opinion. In line with the multiyear work plan, AIReF will publish its second opinion in the first half of 2023.
- **III. Opinion on improvements to the budgetary cycle.** AIReF will prepare an opinion to identify the weaknesses that the budgetary process suffers from, in its opinion, both on content and on procedures, and will present proposed improvements thereto.
- IV. Opinion on the cessation of activity of the self-employed. The contribution rate for benefits for the cessation of activity of the self-employed has been significantly modified in recent years and has now become obligatory; hence, AIReF will analyse the implications on the financial sustainability of the protection system for the cessation of activity in accordance with the provisions of prevailing legislation.

Depending on the development of the rest of the work and the needs identified during the year, the Steering Committee may consider issuing additional opinions on any relevant issue during the year. In this regard, Organic Law 6/2013, of November 14th, on the creation of AIReF, authorises the institution to issue, on its own initiative, opinions on matters related to the budgetary stability and financial sustainability of the General Government.

#### 3. Studies planned for 2023:

I. Completion and publication of studies corresponding to the third evaluation phase of public spending and the Spending Review 2018 – 2021, commissioned to AIReF by the Central Government. The third phase focuses on two issues: the strategic evaluation of financial instruments to support productive sectors, with a special focus on the efficacy of instruments aimed at promoting the internationalisation of Spanish companies, and the evaluation of the management of urban waste.



II. Start of the studies under the first phase of the Spending Review 2022 - 2026 on financial instruments to support productive sectors and healthcare under mutual insurance for civil servants. The Government has already taken note of the Action Plan under the first phase of the Spending Review 2022 – 2026, and hence will begin to evaluate two aspects in 2023: the evaluation of mutual insurance for civil servants and financial instruments to support productive sectors, in particular those relating to digitalisation and innovation.
